	Rolling cart (many like to bring these to make transporting everything easier)

	List of items you need from the exhibit hall. (Please remember that purchasing your
	curriculum and resources onsite is really important many of the families serving yours in
	the exhibit hall. Supporting these organizations and companies while at Teach Them
	Diligently will allow them to return to serve you again.)
	Many will make small mailing labels with your name, address, phone number, and email
	address. That will allow you to share your information quickly and easily.
	A good attitude. :) There will be a lot of people in a convention center setting. The TTD
	team will do everything in our power to make the event as pleasant and wonderful for
	you as possible, but sometimes we all have to be flexible and gracious. Walking into the
	event with that in mind may save you some frustration when situations arise.

	Crock pot for the room. (Many hotels frown on Instant Pots because of the pressure build
	up, so we do not recommend bringing those.)

	your family quickly midday.
	Breakfast items oatmeal packets, boiled eggs, muffins, etc. We save a lot of time and
	money by eating a couple of meals in our room and having a nice dinner out.
	Extra blankets and pillows if you'll have kiddos in the room. (You may also want to bring
	a small twin air mattress if one will be sleeping on the floor. We travel with one in a small
	backpack, so we're always prepared. It was a great \$10 investment!):)
