

More details about the format of our daily NT Challenge:



Each day, you will have a short reading as we move through the New Testament. Since we are taking such short passages of scripture each day, we have the opportunity to go much deeper into them as we study. It has been an incredibly helpful tool for me as it makes me slow down and digest a lot more from the text.

Once you read, share what a takeaway or how God spoke to you through your devotions in the TTD365 discussion group for the NT reading challenge. It's a great accountability tool, and it allows anyone who is interested to get more insight into what you are studying. If you feel that's too intrusive, and you don't want to share a picture-- you can just share a nugget that you learned or even a simple "I read today" or other check-in.

The format for the journaling will utilize the SOAP method of study.

S– The S stands for Scripture- you physically write out the scripture.....you'll be amazed that what God will reveal to you just by taking the time to slow down and actually write out what you are reading!

O– The O stands for observation- what do you see in the verses that you're reading? Who is the audience? Is there a repetition of words? What words stand out to you?

A– The A stands for Application- this is when God's Word becomes personal. What is God saying to me today? How can I apply what I just read to my own personal life? What changes do I need to make? Is there an action that I need to take?

P– And finally P stands for Prayer. Pray God's Word back to Him. If He has revealed something to you during this time in His Word, pray about it. Confess if He has revealed some sin that is in your life.

I always write my prayers there as well, for it's a great reminder to my future self of what God was really working on my heart about-- although that's entirely up to you.
